

HELLO WINTER



Create your own seasonal collage using only color to demonstrate the transition from autumn into winter. As you review Kenard Pak's illustrations in the book, consider his use of colors. How do these colors demonstrate the changes in weather or their impact on nature?

You'll need construction paper, scissors, a glue stick and a piece of cardstock or thin cardboard as your base. Begin by cutting the construction paper into strips of varying widths. We found it is best to keep them all at about a quarter of an inch to a half inch wide. When all the strips are cut, we suggest you begin experimenting with color combinations and variety of width. Once you are happy with your plan, begin gluing down the paper strips to your backing. Gluing small sections at a time will help contain the mess and prevent the glue from hardening too quickly.
