



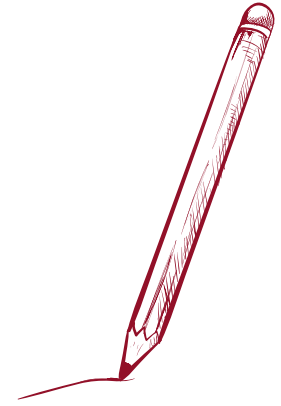

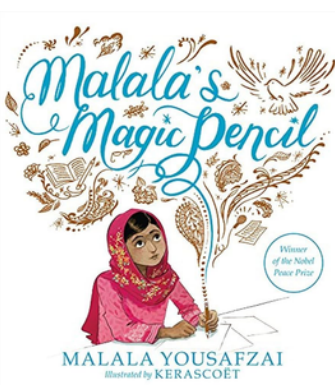


- New family pet
